

Church of Scotland Statistics for Mission Group

If EDINBURGH PORTOBELLO AND JOPPA were a village of 100 people...

- > 7 would be in primary school; 4 would be in high school
- > 26 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 18 would be aged 65 or over
- > 73 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 16 who have no qualifications; 32 who have a University degree
 - 30 who work full time; 11 who are retired
- > 81 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 4 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 10 would be providing unpaid care
- > 27 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If EDINBURGH PORTOBELLO AND JOPPA were a village of 100 households...


- > 36 households would consist of one person, 15 of whom are aged 65 and over


Population Breakdown by Religion



Population Breakdown by Ethnicity/Language











Household composition








