

- > 75 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 21 who have no qualifications; 17 who have a University degree
 - 36 who work full time; 10 who are retired
- > 85 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 5 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 9 would be providing unpaid care
- > 31 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If BROXBURN were a village of 100 households...


- > 30 households would consist of one person, 12 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 31 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 30 would be in rented accomodation
- > 75 would have access to at least one car or van




Population Breakdown by Ethnicity/Language


Population Breakdown by Qualifications


Population Breakdown by Health and Care Provision






Economic activity of those of working age (1)





What to do next

This profile has given you some information about your local community from Scotland's Census 2011. This is not an end in itself, but rather a starting place for you to explore further.

- What other local organisations or centres are there that might bring people into our parish? Examples might include work, public services, leisure, shops and voluntary organisations. How can we interact with these people?
- > What areas of our parish do we know well, or less well?
- > How does the local community change between weekdays and weekends?
