If PEEBLES OLD were a village of 100 people...

- > 8 would be in primary school; 5 would be in high school
- > 21 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 23 would be aged 65 or over
- > 71 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 18 who have no qualifications; 32 who have a University degree
 - 27 who work full time; 15 who are retired
- > 79 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 3 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 9 would be providing unpaid care
- > 37 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If PEEBLES OLD were a village of 100 households...


- > 35 households would consist of one person, 18 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 24 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 27 would be in rented accomodation
- > 79 would have access to at least one car or van




Population Breakdown by Ethnicity/Language




Population Breakdown by Health and Care Provision






Economic activity of those of working age (1)


