

#### If BUTE, THE UNITED CHURCH OF were a village of 100 people...

- > 6 would be in primary school; 4 would be in high school
- > 18 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 27 would be aged 65 or over
- > 73 would be of working age (16-74), including
  - 29 who have no qualifications; 19 who have a University degree
  - 21 who work full time; 18 who are retired
- > 86 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 7 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 11 would be providing unpaid care
- > 41 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

#### If BUTE, THE UNITED CHURCH OF were a village of 100 households...


- > 47 households would consist of one person, 22 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 19 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 44 would be in rented accomodation
- > 59 would have access to at least one car or van
- > 3 would speak a language other than English in the home















## What to do next

- > How does the local community change between weekdays and weekends?

All parish-level Census data is based on 2011 Census Output Areas as released by National Records of Scotland (<u>www.nrscotland.gov.uk</u>). An Output Area is associated with a parish if its population weighted centroid falls within the parish boundary.
