

Parish: DUNFERMLINE ST LEONARD'S



If DUNFERMLINE ST LEONARD'S were a village of 100 people...

- > 7 would be in primary school; 5 would be in high school
- > 26 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 16 would be aged 65 or over
- > 76 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 17 who have no qualifications; 22 who have a University degree
 - 33 who work full time; 13 who are retired
- > 86 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 4 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 9 would be providing unpaid care
- > 30 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If DUNFERMLINE ST LEONARD'S were a village of 100 households...


- > 27 households would consist of one person, 10 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 28 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 23 would be in rented accomodation
- > 81 would have access to at least one car or van
- > 5 would speak a language other than English in the home








Population Breakdown by Health and Care Provision








Economic activity of those of working age (1)




