#### If FOSSOWAY ST SERF'S AND DEVONSIDE were a village of 100 people...

- > 9 would be in primary school; 7 would be in high school
- > 19 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 17 would be aged 65 or over
- > 73 would be of working age (16-74), including
  - 12 who have no qualifications; 33 who have a University degree
  - 25 who work full time; 13 who are retired
- > 80 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 2 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 8 would be providing unpaid care
- > 41 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

#### If FOSSOWAY ST SERF'S AND DEVONSIDE were a village of 100 households...


- > 18 households would consist of one person, 10 of whom are aged 65 and over








