If DUNDEE BROUGHTY FERRY NEW KIRK were a village of 100 households...


- > 33 households would consist of one person, 17 of whom are aged 65 and over


Population Breakdown by Religion


Population Breakdown by Ethnicity/Language










Economic activity of those of working age (1)




