- > 8 would be in primary school; 6 would be in high school
- > 22 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 18 would be aged 65 or over
- > 73 would be of working age (16-74), including
  - 17 who have no qualifications; 25 who have a University degree
  - 29 who work full time; 11 who are retired
- > 78 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 3 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 8 would be providing unpaid care
- > 39 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

#### If WEST GORDON (ALFORD, STRATHDON, RHYNIE) were a village of 100 households...


- > 28 households would consist of one person, 13 of whom are aged 65 and over









#### **Household composition**




