

If CULSALMOND & RAYNE were a village of 100 people...

- > 10 would be in primary school; 4 would be in high school
- > 28 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 10 would be aged 65 or over
- > 75 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 13 who have no qualifications; 28 who have a University degree
 - 36 who work full time; 6 who are retired
- > 77 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 2 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 8 would be providing unpaid care
- > 34 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If CULSALMOND & RAYNE were a village of 100 households...


- > 16 households would consist of one person, 5 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 36 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 13 would be in rented accomodation
- > 97 would have access to at least one car or van
- > 8 would speak a language other than English in the home





Population Breakdown by Ethnicity/Language















What to do next

- > What areas of our parish do we know well, or less well?
- > How does the local community change between weekdays and weekends?
