

If ABERDOUR were a village of 100 people...

- > 6 would be in primary school; 3 would be in high school
- > 22 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 20 would be aged 65 or over
- > 81 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 30 who have no qualifications; 16 who have a University degree
 - 31 who work full time; 12 who are retired
- > 73 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 8 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 13 would be providing unpaid care
- > 38 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If ABERDOUR were a village of 100 households...


- > 28 households would consist of one person, 10 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 22 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 13 would be in rented accomodation
- > 92 would have access to at least one car or van
- > 11 would speak a language other than English in the home







Population Breakdown by Health and Care Provision










Economic activity of those of working age (1)





All parish-level Census data is based on 2011 Census Output Areas as released by National Records of Scotland (<u>www.nrscotland.gov.uk</u>). An Output Area is associated with a parish if its population weighted centroid falls within the parish boundary.
