#### If LAGGAN AND NEWTONMORE were a village of 100 people...

- > 7 would be in primary school; 5 would be in high school
- > 21 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 22 would be aged 65 or over
- > 73 would be of working age (16-74), including
  - 20 who have no qualifications; 25 who have a University degree
  - 27 who work full time; 12 who are retired
- > 76 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 3 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 10 would be providing unpaid care
- > 41 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

#### If LAGGAN AND NEWTONMORE were a village of 100 households...


- > 33 households would consist of one person, 16 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 22 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)








### Population Breakdown by Health and Care Provision






#### Economic activity of those of working age (1)




