

If NORTH WEST LOCHABER were a village of 100 people...

- > 8 would be in primary school; 5 would be in high school
- > 23 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 17 would be aged 65 or over
- > 75 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 20 who have no qualifications; 24 who have a University degree
 - 26 who work full time; 11 who are retired
- > 76 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 4 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 9 would be providing unpaid care
- > 27 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If NORTH WEST LOCHABER were a village of 100 households...


- > 32 households would consist of one person, 12 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 26 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 32 would be in rented accomodation
- > 81 would have access to at least one car or van
- > 10 would speak a language other than English in the home




Church of Scotland Statistics for Mission Group

Population Breakdown by Ethnicity/Language






Economic activity of those of working age (1)





- > How does the local community change between weekdays and weekends?

All parish-level Census data is based on 2011 Census Output Areas as released by National Records of Scotland (<u>www.nrscotland.gov.uk</u>). An Output Area is associated with a parish if its population weighted centroid falls within the parish boundary.
