

If DURNESS & KINLOCHBERVIE were a village of 100 people...

- > 7 would be in primary school; 6 would be in high school
- > 19 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 19 would be aged 65 or over
- > 74 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 24 who have no qualifications; 23 who have a University degree
 - 26 who work full time; 11 who are retired
- > 75 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 5 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 11 would be providing unpaid care
- > 45 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If DURNESS & KINLOCHBERVIE were a village of 100 households...


- > 39 households would consist of one person, 18 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 21 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 25 would be in rented accomodation
- > 84 would have access to at least one car or van
- > 3 would speak a language other than English in the home











All parish-level Census data is based on 2011 Census Output Areas as released by National Records of Scotland (<u>www.nrscotland.gov.uk</u>). An Output Area is associated with a parish if its population weighted centroid falls within the parish boundary.
